The following International Phonetics for English Alphabets have been adopted in place of the existing Police Code and are to be enforced with effect from 1.5.1970 on all our R/T channels.

The actual pronunciation of the Phonetics is mentioned against each word to be used for the alphabets so that no difficulty is experienced by the Operator on the receiving end.
